



**Building for Self-Sufficiency Capital Campaign
Naming Opportunities**

The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center

\$800,000
COMMITTED

This is an opportunity to name the entire 2 ½ acre campus after an individual, family or business.

Program Building

\$500,000

This 20,000 square foot building houses the Adult Development Center Open Classroom & Program area. This is where support is provided for individuals with the most profoundly disabling cognitive and physical challenges. There are eight day program classrooms, vocational training program areas, and the Administrative Office Complex is located in this building.

Training Building

\$400,000

This 10,000 square foot building includes the Dining Room, Commercial Kitchen, Computer Resource Lab, Star Store, two classrooms, meeting rooms, conference room, and copy room. Participants engage in pre-employment training activities and learn essential work skills.

Courtyard

\$250,000

This open outdoor green space is surrounded by trees, shrubs and flowers. It is place participants and family members gather to socialize, share a meal, read, or relax.

Community Room

\$250,000

This multi-purpose room is used for a variety of activities. Individuals gather in this space in the morning before heading to the classrooms or out in the community. Clubs like our People First Self-Advocacy Group meet here. It is also open to community groups for meetings and special events.

Kitchen

\$100,000
COMMITTED

A commercial-quality kitchen allows chefs to create meals for large groups daily. Program participants learn essential food preparation work skills while earning a paycheck. Working in the kitchen enhances their employment and social skills with the ultimate goal of employment in the community. Prepare 400 meals daily for children from low income families attending local preschools.

Dining Room

\$100,000

This open area serves as a cafeteria where participants, staff, and family members can enjoy meals and also a space where individuals gather for other activities.

Administrative Office Complex

\$100,000

This area includes the main lobby and offices for the program director and staff members. There is also a meeting room to discuss strategic care and concerns with family members or caregivers.

Lobby

\$100,000

The Lobby will be the entry point of contact and first impression for participants, their families and guests entering the center. With high ceilings and open space it presents a professional and welcoming environment to all visitors.

Computer Resource Lab

\$50,000

Program participants use computers with Internet access to maintain and improve communication, self-advocacy, and vocational skills. Adaptive technology such as touch screens, oversized mouse pads, and large keyboards ensure computer access regardless of any disabilities. Participants seeking employment opportunities receive coaching to develop their resumes and identify potential jobs in the community.

Conference Room

\$50,000

This room will be available for meetings with families, caregivers, and staff as they discuss strategic care. Board and Committee members gather here throughout the day for meetings.

Terrace

\$50,000

This space located next to the Day Program Building is shaded and includes tables and chairs for participants to eat lunch, socialize and, enjoy the outdoors. The peaceful setting helps participants relax.

Meeting Rooms

**\$50,000
(3 Available)**

These rooms will be utilized for meetings with families, caregivers, and staff as they discuss strategic care. Board and Committee members gather here throughout the day.

Adult Development Center Classroom

**\$27,000
COMMITTED**

Individuals participating in activities in this classroom have severe cognitive and physical challenges. Many are non-ambulatory due to a wide variety of disabilities. This space also provides opportunities to increase health, fitness, and well-being through a variety of physical activities.

Star Store

\$25,000

This participant-run snack bar allows individuals to gain work skills while offering healthy snacks.

Classrooms

\$25,000
(10 Available)

Sensory Classroom

The Sensory Room equipment provides opportunities for individuals to maintain or improve self-help, socialization and sensory-perceptual-motor skills. Items such as a heated vibrating waterbed, bubble light tube, rocking wedge chair, floor mats, bean bags and sensory wall boards could be utilized in this room.

Fitness Recreation Classroom

This classroom provides opportunities for individuals to work on sensory and motor skills. Adaptive equipment will be available for individuals to improve their general physical and mental well-being.

Multi-Media Classroom

The Multi-Media Room offers educational programming and entertainment in a group setting that fosters socialization and learning skills. This includes opportunities to share cultural experiences, socialize with family and peers, exercise to fitness programs, teach important lessons, and develop critical thinking skills.

Animal & Nature Classroom

In the Animal/Nature Room there are opportunities for consumers to increase socialization, sensory-perceptual-motor skills and communication skills. Pets on-site will be utilized as pet therapy and nature will be introduced in variety of ways.

Therapeutic Spa Classroom

The Therapeutic Spa Room is where consumers will receive staff support to focus on self-help skills such as hygiene and grooming as well as sensory-perceptual-motor skills and communication skills. Simulated manicures and pedicures will be enjoyed with the benefit of light massage provided by staff.

Arts and Crafts Classroom

COMMITTED

Art enrichment classes in this room provide an opportunity for self-expression and creativity that contributes to the consumer's overall sense of achievement and well-being. The Art Gallery will provide a space for consumers to display their creative talents as well as offer their artwork for sale to the public.

Music Classroom

Music therapy can be an effective educational and therapeutic tool. It creates opportunities to increase self-awareness and self-esteem. It also can assist with stimulating and motivating a person's speech.

Health & Fitness Classroom

In this classroom, individuals focus on fitness activities that help build muscle, increase flexibility, improve diets, and increase overall wellness. One-on-one coaching and small group classes help participants reach their goals.

Seniors Classrooms (2)

Individuals approximately 50 years and older who are participating in Senior Transition Services participate in recreational and therapeutic activities geared toward older adults' needs. They also engage in part-time, paid employment and volunteer service opportunities.

Offices

\$15,000

Staff offices adjacent to the program areas are where staff discuss and implement strategic care.

Picnic Table Seating

The picnic tables provide the perfect spot for our program participants to enjoy lunch or a snack outdoors at the center.

Bench

These benches are found throughout the outdoor areas at the center and provide an opportunity to sit and soak up some sunshine, relax with friends, or enjoy a quiet moment.

Trees
