### Donor Spotlight: The Griffiths

Rhonda was a helper. She volunteered in the classroom with her mother who taught preschoolers for many years. She awaited the mailman daily and greeted him with enthusiasm. She cheerfully shared duties to make her home a clean and happy place to live. She loved the Safari Park, where it was as if Animal Planet on television came to life. Birds were her favorite animal and she was very nurturing toward her pet parakeet.

Unfortunately, Rhonda's signs of developmental and intellectual delay were overlooked until much later in her childhood. Today, parents

and caregivers are detecting signs of delay much sooner, and programs like The Arc of San Diego's Early Intervention Services are giving children from birth to three years old a far stronger chance of being placed into mainstream classrooms and not needing continued support. While Rhonda did not receive services from The Arc of San Diego during her lifetime, her quardians Don & Margaret

(Pete) Griffith were certain that her estate should positively impact the community served by The Arc of San Diego. That is why they decided to make an incredible gift of \$250,000 to support

renovations at The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center.

In honor of this generous support, the building at The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center where our Early Intervention Services are provided will be named The Bayne Family Child Development Center. This felt like the right decision for her guardians to make after reminiscing on the special experience Rhonda had as a helper in her mother's

classroom for many years. Even 30 years later, Rhonda still received holiday cards from the same preschool.

The Arc of San Diego is honored to be the recipient of such a generous gift and recognizes how special it is for The Griffiths to have the confidence they do in our life-enhancing programs and services. Thanks to their gift, Rhonda Bayne's generous spirit and legacy will live on.

The live auction boasted alluring experiences including a trip for 10 to Las Gaviotas Resort in Baja California with wine tasting in Valle de Guadalupe.

The auction was followed by a meal that pleased every craving, followed by an inviting buffet of desserts. Once dinner concluded, guests

were entertained by Wayne Foster Music & Entertainment, who inspired a night filled with dancing and good will. Such revelry was outmatched only by the opening performance to "All that Jazz" by Alanna Roberson, a client at The Arc of San Diego.

## We Completed Our Copley Foundation Challenge Grant!

The Arc of San Diego is proud to announce that it has met its goal for the David C. Copley Foundation Challenge Grant. Funds raised will assist with completing a \$4.5 million goal to finish renovations at The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center in Chula Vista. The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center serves over 300 children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Over 185 adults participate in the day program which focuses on increasing independence, developing social skills, strengthening vocational skills, and participating in wellness activities. Approximately 65 people with disabilities earn a paycheck through their work at the center in our vocational training program. Additionally, 50 children with developmental delays or those at risk for delay participate in high quality early intervention services at this center.

Last year, The Copley Foundation generously committed a challenge grant of \$225,000 – provided that The Arc was able to raise \$450,000 in one year. All donations made to The Arc for the capital campaign during this time period would be matched by The Copley Foundation.


"The excitement of receiving a challenge grant from the David C. Copley Foundation brought much enthusiasm to our agency," said Jennifer Bates Navarra, Vice President of Marketing and Development. "This challenge grant has been a catalyst to encourage new donors throughout the community to support our campaign." For Vanessa Yee, the mother of two Arc clients, the funding is crucial for children with disabilities, like her son Ezekiel. She is grateful for support from The Arc of San Diego in helping Ezekiel to develop his speech and strengthen motor skills. His younger sister, Leilani, also benefited from The Arc's services. Because of the impact of Early Intervention Services, both children are now students in mainstream classrooms.

"The Arc of San Diego creates a thriving environment for children and adults of all abilities to connect, learn & participate meaningfully," Vanessa said.

In December 2018, The Arc made exciting progress in raising funds for the match challenge when it received a \$250,000 gift from Mr. and Mrs. Donald Griffith for the naming of the Child Development Center at the site. This center will be named The Bayne Family Child Development Center in honor of this gift. Additionally, The Arc received grants from The Hervey Family Fund at The San Diego Foundation, the Stephen & Mary Birch Foundation, and The Parker Foundation.

The funds raised will assist with renovations at The Sol and Ruth Gerber Family Center and assist our organization with providing critical services that ensure every member of our community thrives for many generations to come. We thank The Copley Foundation for their generosity for assisting with this goal and helping us to complete our capital campaign!
